Presentations will take place on September 25th and 26th. Presenters are encouraged to engage in interactive presentations to address the conference topic, Envisioning Our Water Future. We ask that you please focus your presentations on how your program activities bring a fresh approach to Project WET and ensure the success in the future. Presentations will be limited to less than 30 minutes unless approved for additional time. We look forward to learning about your best practices, successes and proven techniques.

Suggested topics for presentations include but are not limited to:

- Water Conservation
- Water Reuse
- Climate Change
- Innovations in Water Technology
- Protecting Waterways and Oceans

Deadline for submission is April 1, 2019. Selections will be made by May 1, 2019.

All forms of presentation are important to Project WET. Please consider which type of presentation best suits your topic and expertise.

Program Presentations

Presenters have the opportunity to speak to an audience of peers about your water education program. In the spirit of Project WET, we encourage interactive presentations.

Lightning Talks

These presentations are short and powerful—think TEDx or Pecha Kucha talks. This is a great way to highlight your work or present thought-provoking ideas for discussion during the conference. These talks will be limited to seven minutes.

Activity Presentation

Conduct a hands-on activity to share information about water. Project WET activities are encouraged!

Conference Audience

During presentation sessions the conference will be open to both Project WET Coordinators and partners such as facilitators, educators and sponsors. Project WET Coordinators are the leaders who manage Project WET programs in a designated area and state. Coordinators work for and with a wide variety of institutions including non-profit organizations, governments, universities and private nature reserves.

Project WET facilitators and educators bring the Project WET program and educational materials into classrooms. Most are environmentally focused, but some educators are math, all-encompassing “science” or physical education teachers. Project WET educators are pre-K through high school. This diverse group of people may reach different target audiences and work in different agencies or subjects; however, all share one common interest: empowering youth to become water stewards through effective, hands-on water education.

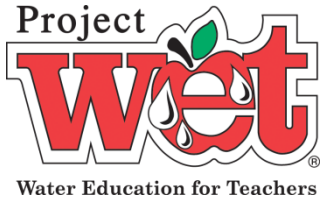
